An Act to amend the Education Act, 1915-1965.

[Assented to 10th February, 1966.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Education Act Amendment Act, 1965-1966".
- (2) The Education Act, 1915-1965, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Education Act, 1915-1966".
- (3) The Education Act, 1915-1965, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Incorporation.

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act.

Amendment of principal Act, s. 18c—

Long service leave of teachers employed by certain bodies and of teachers and employees of certain governments upon transfer to State teaching service.

3. Subsection (5) of section 18c of the principal Act is struck out and the following subsection is inserted in lieu thereof :—

(5) Where a person has been, or, is appointed as a teacher, whether before or after the commencement of the Education Act Amendment Act, 1965-1966, and his service as a teacher is continuous either—

- (a) with his service as a teacher under the Council of the South Australian Institute of Technology or the South Australian School of Mines or the Townsend House School for Deaf and Blind Children ; or

(b) with his service, as an employee (whether as a teacher or otherwise) of the Commonwealth, or of any State,

the continuous service of that person under the Council of the South Australian Institute of Technology or the South Australian School of Mines or the Townsend House School for Deaf and Blind Children or as an employee of the Commonwealth, or of any State, as the case may be, shall for the purpose of long service leave under this section be regarded as service as a teacher.
