An Act for the appropriation of money from the Consolidated Account for the year ending on 30 June 1996 and for other purposes.

[Assented to 3 August 1995]

The Parliament of South Australia enacts as follows:

Short title

1. This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act 1995*.

Commencement

2. This Act will be taken to have come into operation on 1 July 1995.

Interpretation

3. In this Act—

"administrative unit" means an administrative structure established or continued in existence by the *Government Management and Employment Act 1985* or the *Public Sector Management Act 1995*;

"agency" means a Minister, an administrative unit (including part of an administrative unit) or any other instrumentality or agency of the Crown.

Issue and application of money

4. (1) The Treasurer may, in accordance with this section on or before 30 June 1996, issue and apply money from the Consolidated Account for the purposes listed in the schedule.

(2) The aggregate of the amounts issued and applied by the Treasurer under subsection (1) and under the *Supply Act 1995* for each of the purposes listed in the schedule must not exceed the amounts set out opposite each of those purposes in that schedule.

(3) Money may be issued and applied under subsection (1) in respect of liabilities or financial commitments that were incurred or made before 1 July 1995.

Application of money where functions, etc., of agency are transferred

5. Where the schedule appropriates money for an agency and—

- (a) some of the functions or duties of the agency are transferred to another agency; or
- (b) the agency is abolished or dissolved and some or all of its functions or duties become the functions or duties of another agency,

the Treasurer may apply part or all of that money to enable the responsible agency to carry out those functions or duties.

Expenditure from Hospitals Fund

6. The Treasurer may issue and apply money from the special deposit account known as the "Hospitals Fund" for the provision, maintenance, development and improvement of public hospitals and equipment used in public hospitals.

Appropriation, etc., in addition to other appropriations, etc.

7. Money may be appropriated, issued or applied under this Act in addition to any money that may be appropriated, issued or applied under any other Act.

Overdraft limit

8. The overdraft limit for the purposes of section 16(3) of the *Public Finance and Audit Act 1987* is fifty million dollars.
