An Act to amend the Prison Acts, 1869 to 1928, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, November 29th, 1934.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Prison Acts Amendment Act, 1934." Short titles

(2) The Prison Acts, 1869 to 1928, and this Act may be cited as the Prison Acts, 1869 to 1934.

2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in section 1 of this Act, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation.

3. If any person is pursuant to The Coroners Act, 1884, or Part V. of the Justices Act, 1921, or otherwise committed to appear for trial or for sentence before any Court of Oyer and Terminer or General Gaol Delivery to be held within any Circuit Court District within the meaning of the Act No. 6 of 1868-9, he may be committed to any Police Prison within the said district. Power to commit persons to police prisons.

4. Section 32 of the Prison Act, 1869 (as amended by section 6 of The Prison Act Amendment Act, 1912) is amended by inserting therein after the words "the first day of holding such" Amendment of principal Act, s. 32—

5. Section 9 of The Prison Act Amendment Act, 1912, is amended by striking out the word “seven” in the third line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word “fourteen”.
