An Act to amend the Prison Acts, 1869 to 1928, and
for other purposes.

[Assented to, November 29th, 1934.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South
Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament
thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Prison Acts Amend- Short titles
ment Act, 1934.

(2) The Prison Acts, 1869 to 1928, and this Act may be cited
as the Prison Acts, 1869 to 1934.

2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned Incorporation.

5. Section 9 of The Prison Act Amendment Act, 1912, is amended by striking out the word “seven” in the third line thereof and by inserting in lieu thereof the word “fourteen”.
