An Act for the General Appropriation of the Revenue for the year ending Thirtieth June, Nineteen Hundred and Thirty-six, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, 14th November, 1935.]

WHEREAS, by various Acts and Ordinances of the State of South Australia, certain moneys are or may be collected, to be paid to the Treasurer on behalf of His Majesty, His heirs and successors, for the public uses of the said State and support of the Government thereof: And whereas certain other moneys are or may become payable to the said State for the like uses, under the provisions of the Commonwealth of Australia Constitution Act, 63 & 64 Vict. ch. 12—

Preamble.

Be it therefore enacted by the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Parliament of South Australia, as follows :

1. Out of the said moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia, and the produce of all or any other the General Public Revenues of the said State, not otherwise by law specially appropriated, there shall or may be further issued the sum of five million and twelve thousand three hundred and thirty-nine pounds.

Further issue.

2. Out of the sum of five hundred thousand pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 2198 of 1935, the sum of eight hundred thousand pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 2203 of 1935, the sum of eight hundred thousand

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pounds issued under the authority of the Act No. 2204 of 1935, and the said sum of five million and twelve thousand three hundred and thirty-nine pounds by this Act authorised to be issued, there shall or may be applied in the manner hereinafter mentioned, any sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money hereinafter specified, that is to say—

3. The issue and payment by the Treasurer, from time to time, of any sums or sums of money for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, not exceeding in the whole the sums respectively in that behalf hereinbefore specified, to such persons and in such portions as the Governor has heretofore directed by any order or orders in writing signed by him and

Treasurer to pay the orders of Governor, and discharge by receipt of party.

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countersigned by the Chief Secretary, or may hereafter direct by any order or orders so signed and countersigned, is hereby authorised; and the said Treasurer shall, in his accounts, be allowed credit for all sums paid by him in pursuance of such orders accordingly; and the receipts of the persons to whom such sums have been or are so paid shall be to him a full discharge for the sum or sums for which the same receipts shall be or are respectively given, and the amounts thereof shall be passed to his credit in account accordingly.

Power to issue money other than revenue or money received from the Commonwealth.

4. If the moneys paid by the Commonwealth of Australia and the produce of the General Public Revenues of the State are insufficient to make the payments authorised by section 2 of this Act, moneys may be issued to make good the deficiency out of loan funds or other public funds or out of moneys raised by way of bank overdraft.

Power of Treasurer to make certain retrospective payments.

5. (1) In addition to making any other payments authorised by law the Treasurer may, at his discretion, out of the moneys appropriated by this Act, make the following payments:—

- (a) He may, in respect of the period commencing on the eighth of March, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, and ending on the day preceding the passing of this Act, pay to any teacher or other person employed in the Education Department of the State a sum not exceeding the difference between the salary actually received by that teacher or person in respect of that period, and any greater salary which would have been payable to him in respect of that period in accordance with the award of the Industrial Court relating to teachers and inspectors, made on the twenty-sixth of February, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, or in accordance with any regulation or practice of the Education Department, if that award had been operative during that period:
- (b) He may, in respect of the period commencing on the first of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-four, and ending on the day preceding the passing of this Act, pay to any person in the Public Service a sum not exceeding the difference between the salary actually received by that person in respect of that period and any greater salary which would have been payable to him in respect of that period pursuant to the award of the Industrial Court relating to the Public Service, made on the fourth of December, nineteen hundred and thirty-four, if that award had been operative during that period:
- (c) He may, in respect of the period commencing on the first of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, and ending on the first of November, nineteen hundred and

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thirty-five, pay to any other person in the Public Service of the State a sum not exceeding the difference between the salary actually received by that person in respect of that period and any greater salary which would have been payable to him in respect of that period, had the salaries fixed by the return of the Classification and Efficiency Board dated the twenty-sixth of September, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, been payable during that period:

- (d) He may, in respect of the period commencing on the first of July, nineteen hundred and thirty-five, and ending on the day preceding the passing of this Act pay to any person employed by the South Australian Railways Commissioner a sum not exceeding the difference between the salary actually received by that person in respect of that period, and any greater salary which would have been payable to him in respect of that period pursuant to the revised classification of railway officers (as defined in this paragraph), if that classification had been operative during that period.

In this paragraph "revised classification of railway officers" means a classification of railway officers and their salaries, to be prescribed by regulation to be made by the South Australian Railways Commissioner and approved by the Governor, at or about the time of the passing of this Act.

(2) Where by any award, return or regulation mentioned in subsection (1) of this section any salary is reduced, the reduction shall not take effect (except where the Treasurer otherwise directs), in respect of any period before the passing of this Act.

(3) Where any person has before the passing of this Act ceased to be employed in the Education Department, or in the Public Service, or by the South Australian Railways Commissioner, and would if he were so employed at the time of such passing be entitled to a payment under this section, the Treasurer may at his discretion make such a payment to that person or, if he is dead, to his personal representatives or such other person as the Treasurer thinks fit.
