GOVERNMENT SUPPORTS COOBER PEDY COMMUNITY HALL.

The State Government has made an immediate grant of \$10,000 to the Coober Pedy Progress Association so that work can commence on a community hall for Coober Pedy, the Premier, Mr. Dunstan, announced today.

As well, the Premier said the Government was prepared to help finance the rest of the building costs, estimated at between \$30-40,000.

"During my recent visit to Coober Pedy the Progress Association stressed the need for a new hall in the town and I was able to make arrangements for \$10,000 to be provided straight away", Mr. Dunstan said.

"That cheque has already been sent and I have written to Mr. Mavropoulos, the Association President, saying we will consider subsidising the rest of the cost.

"Community halls serve a very important function in towns such as Coober Pedy and the Government is anxious that a centre for the people of the town is established as soon as possible.

"We are prepared to subsidise, on a dollar for dollar basis, the balance of the building costs.

"When I discussed the need for a hall during my visit, the Association said they had been interested in buying a building from the Maralinga site and that this could be moved to Coober Pedy and re-erected if assistance was given. I have asked the Association for a specific proposition as to how this could be done, and I am sure the Government and the people of Coober Pedy together will get the hall built.

"During my visit to Coober Pedy I was very impressed with the great community feeling and pride in Coober Pedy. I am sure that a centre such as the Association is proposing will be a very great asset to the town".
