## INDUSTRIAL DEMOCRACY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

A 12 member committee with representatives of employers, trade unions and public sector bodies has been appointed to advise the State Government on its industrial democracy programme.

The Premier, Mr. Dunstan, said the tripartite committee would enable direct communication between the Government and various groups interested in industrial democracy.

"The Committee will have direct access to me and will work closely with the Unit for Industrial Democracy," Mr. Dunstan said.

"It will keep the Government informed of matters concerning industrial democracy raised by industry, trade unions or other groups.

"The Government wants its policies in such an important area to be widely discussed and understood.

"Industrial democracy is essential for modern industrialised societies, but the introduction of such a far reaching policy can only come about with community involvement.

"That involvement must be based on a clear understanding of the gradual and long term nature of the Government's policies.

"The Advisory Committee will perform a very important role in developing that understanding.

"As well, I have instructed the Executive Officer of the Unit for Industrial Democracy to be available to give monthly briefings on industrial democracy matters to the Leader of the Opposition, Dr. Tonkin, and the Shadow Minister of Labour and Industry, Mr. Brown".

- a. examine and report on matters referred to it by the Minister
- b. keep the Government informed on matters raised by industry and commerce, trade unions and the public sector and in turn, advise them of Government initiatives
- c. consult with the Executive Officer of the Unit for Industrial Democracy on matters referred to it by the Unit
- d. examine existing and future industrial democracy programmes referred to it by the Government
