NEW POLICE STATION FOR CLARE

A new police station and residence is to be built at Clare at a cost of \$575,000, the Premier, Mr. Dunstan, announced today.

The Premier, who visited Clare to open the Clare Show, said tenders for the new building would be let next July and work would start by the end of 1977. \$30,000 would be spent in the 1976-77 financial year, \$280,000 the following year and \$265,000 in 1978-79. The building should be finished by October 1978.

"The new station will be an important government centre for Clare", Mr. Dunstan said.

"It will be imaginatively designed and will have a general police officer, C.I.D. rooms, sergeants office, interview and test areas, staff rooms and facilities and a lost property room.

"The cell block will have three double cells and two single cells", the Premier said.

"The new residence will provide excellent accommodation and the whole development will be a great asset to the town".

"The architects have already prepared sketch plans which have been approved by the Police Department. Planning assent has been given by the Clare Council.

"The Government has a continuing policy of decentralising Government services to ensure that people in country areas have facilities of the same standard as those of city areas".
