NEW POWER LINE FOR WEST COAST

Tenders are now being called for the construction of the new \$3.2 million power line to the Streaky Bay, Ceduna and Port Kenny areas, the Premier, Mr. Dunstan, said today.

Speaking during a visit to Ceduna Mr. Dunstan said the Government was determined that the new 66 kV line would be built as soon as possible.

"The Government expects the main supply will be available at Karcultaby, Poochera and Port Kenny by late 1977 and at Ceduna, Wirrulla and Streaky Bay by early 1978.

"This new line is part of the Government's commitment of providing first class services to the people living in the country areas of the State", Mr. Dunstan said.

"With ETSA power available to these towns it will enable the local power stations to be closed.
