NEW FACTORY TO OPEN

The new tube making factory of Hills Industries Ltd. at O'Sullivan Beach will be opened by the Premier (Mr. Don Dunstan) at 3.30 p.m. on Friday 14/7/67.

The new factory covers an area of 84,000 sq. ft. and is the first stage in the development of Hills' 40 acre site. At present it is devoted to the manufacture of steel and aluminium tubing.

The present stage of development represents an investment of \$1 million in land, buildings and plant.

The Hills company group has grown from a small shed in Glen Osmond to today's seven manufacturing plants in five States of Australia and at Auckland, New Zealand. There is also a branch in the United Kingdom and products are manufactured under licence in South Africa.

The opening of the new factory is the culmination of a week-long conference of 20 managers and executives from all States of Australia and New Zealand.

During the week the company celebrated its 21st birthday.

At the opening ceremony the Premier will be supported by the Federal Minister of Health, Dr. A.J. Forbes.

During the afternoon, Mr. Frank Walsh, M.P., will unveil a memorial plaque to the company's late Chairman and Managing Director, Mr. H.E. Ling. The plaque is the centrepiece of a memorial garden which came about as a result of spontaneous requests by the company's staff in interstate branches, London and Auckland, to subscribe to build the Memorial.
