The Liberal Government has at last announced its intentions about price control publicly. The Premier has said that the Liberal Party is opposed to price control and clearly on their stated policy they will abolish it. This will hit every family's pocket in South Australia. Already the removal from price control of 32 items under the present Government has produced cost-of-living increases where it hurts. It was an essential feature of Sir Thomas Playford's policy in seeking a low cost structure for South Australia in order to compete with the costs in other States that price control was maintained to keep down the pressure of prices on the wage in South Australia. The Hall Government proposes to dispose of this essential feature of Playford policy and throw the average citizen of South Australia to the wolves of uncontrolled price increases.
