PRESS RELEASE FROM THE CHIEF SECRETARY, MR. SHARD.

PORT LINCOLN POLICE STATION.

19.7.72

Cabinet has approved a contract for a new police station at Port Lincoln, the Chief Secretary, Mr. Shard, announced today.

The two-storey station and cell block cost nearly a quarter of a million dollars.

The contract has been let to M.J. Buddle and Sons of Port Lincoln.

Mr. Shard said the new building would occupy a $\frac{3}{4}$ acre site at the corner of Adelaide Place and Liverpool Street.

He said space and facilities in the existing station were already inadequate, and the need for further accommodation would increase as Port Lincoln's population grew.

The existing police station will be demolished to make way for the new complex, and minor alterations will be made to the existing police residence to provide a temporary police station during rebuilding.

The two storey block facing Liverpool Street will provide police station accomodation on the ground floor, and the divisional headquarters, women police and C.I.B. offices on the first floor.

A second block will contain the garage, single constables' quarters, and the cell block.

Mr. Shard said he expected the new complex would be completed towards the end of next year.
