SEPTEMBER UNEMPLOYMENT FIGURES.

Commenting on the September unemployment figures, the Premier, Mr. Dunstan, said any decline in the number of jobless is welcome.

"I am particularly pleased that the figures for South Australia and the Northern Territory show a bigger drop than the national average.

" I hope that the October figures will be further reduced as a consequence of the State Government's action in providing special funds for the metropolitan unemployment relief, for which the Commonwealth has not given us assistance."

But, the Premier said, the small improvement in seasonally adjusted figures coming after successive months of very high rises was disturbing.

"On present projections, Australia faces an unemployment level of 170,000 next January, when the new intake of school leavers start to look for jobs.

"This obviously is not good enough. The conclusion is inescapable that there is still a need for Federal Government action to stimulate demand - not empty claims that everything is going to be all right", the Premier said.
