DUMPING - FIBREGLASS INSECT SCREENING

The Minister for Customs and Excise (Senator Murphy) has accepted the findings of the Industries Assistance Commission as follows:

- (a) fibreglass insect screening has been sold to persons in Australia at export prices which are less than the normal values in the countries of exportation;
- (b) the exportation of those goods has caused and is threatening injury to an Australian industry; and
- (c) dumping duties should be applied to goods under reference exported on or after 13 April 1972.

The Minister accordingly will publish a notice in the Australian Government Gazette of 11 June 1974:

specifying fibreglass insect screening exported to Australia on or after 13 April 1972 as subject to dumping duty.

REVOCATION OF DUMPING GAZETTAL

The following Customs Tariff (Dumping and Subsidies) Act Notice has been revoked:

Notice No. 14(1972) published in Commonwealth of Australia Gazette No. 76 of 17 August 1972 relating to copper oxychloride and preparations containing not less than 10 per centum by weight of copper oxychloride, calculated by reference to the total weight of the preparations. Revoked by Notice No. 35 (1974) operative on 27 May 1974.

The revocation notice will appear in the Australian Government Gazette of 11 June 1974.
