WITHDRAWAL OF DUMPING INVESTIGATION

The Minister for Customs and Excise (Senator Murphy) has accepted the findings of the Industries Assistance Commission following its inquiry into the dumping of injection moulding machines in Australia.

Anti-dumping action on these goods has now been cancelled and dumping cash securities taken on past shipments are being returned to importers.

Revocation of Dumping Gazettals

The following commodities will be notified in the Australian Government Gazette of 6 August 1974 as no longer subject to anti-dumping action operative on 25 July 1974:

- augers and auger bits
- grinding wheels of the depressed centre type and cutting off wheels, being goods of agglomerated natural or artificial abrasives.
