PRESS RELEASE FROM THE PREMIER, MR. DUNSTAN.

LOAN ESTIMATES.

Record State Government spending on building schools and hospital projects in the new financial year was today announced by the Premier, Mr. Dunstan.

Mr. Dunstan - as State Treasurer - was presenting his Loan Estimates to Parliament.

He said school and hospital building programmes in the year to June 30 next would cost an estimated \$63.7m. This compared with some \$50.7m spent the year before.

Total Government Loan Programme for the year was \$181m with the school, hospital, waterworks and sewer programmes getting most of the money.

Schemes include developments costing \$1.38m at Glenside and Hillcrest Hospitals, hospital development at Mount Gambier and Port Pirie.

Mr. Dunstan said the money spent on education would enable work to start on 48 new pre-school, primary and secondary schools and further education schemes during the year.

Also included in the total programme is \$3.2m for dental clinics, the new School of Dental Therapy and Dental Therapy Training Clinic in Adelaide.

Outside Parliament Mr. Dunstan said the record spending and continuing emphasis on education and health was a reflection of the high priority given by the State Government to expansion in those areas.
