Increased stamp duties on cheques and other financial documents are expected to apply from December 16, the Premier, Mr. Dunstan, announced today.

Mr. Dunstan said that the Stamp Duties Act Amendment Bill had been passed by Parliament and was expected to receive assent next Tuesday.

It was expected that the provisions of the Act relating to cheques, conveyances, discharge of mortgages and annual licences would come into force from Monday, December 16. The provisions for registration or transfer of motor vehicles and the increase in the duty on renewal of third party insurance policies would operate from Tuesday, January 2.
