GOVERNMENT LETS \$10M CONTRACTS.

The State Government has let contracts worth \$10 million for two big new public building projects in Adelaide, the Premier, Mr. Dunstan, announced today.

One is for a new Motor Vehicles Department building in Wakefield Street and the other is for a Forensic Sciences Institute Building in Divett Place.

Mr. Dunstan said the State Government had let the contracts now despite present tightness of funds because of the effect they would have on stability of employment in the building industry.

Contracts for both projects were awarded to Hansen & Yuncken Pty Ltd.

Total cost is about \$10 million.

The new Forensic Sciences Institute Building, to be erected in Divett Place, will house the Department of Chemistry, the City Mortuary, the Coroner's Department and accommodation for the Director of Forensic Pathology.

These departments are currently scattered throughout the city and are operating in restricted and difficult conditions.

The new building will cost about \$6 million and should be occupied by mid 1977.

The new Motor Vehciles Department building, on the corner of Wakefield Street and Gawler Place, will replace present poor facilities at the Railway Building. Cost is about \$4 million.

The building will provide five storeys of accommodation together with a basement car park.

Work will begin shortly and the building will be in use in early 1977.

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
