An Act to amend "The Vaccination Act," No. 248 of 1882.

[Assented to, December 17th, 1892.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. Every parent shall be entitled, upon giving notice by registered letter addressed to "The Vaccination Officer, Adelaide," within six months after the birth of any child, to require that the vaccination of such child shall be performed with calf lymph, and shall in such notice state the name and address of the qualified medical practitioner or public vaccinator by whom he desires such child shall be vaccinated. After receipt of such notice the said vaccination officer shall forward to the said practitioner or public vaccinator calf lymph for such vaccination, and shall send notice by registered letter to such parent of the forwarding of such lymph. No parent who has attended within six days after the posting of such last mentioned registered letter, or within such further time or times as may be fixed by such practitioner or public vaccinator, and has then submitted the child for vaccination with calf lymph, shall be punishable for neglecting or refusing to take such child or cause it to be taken to be vaccinated.

Parent or guardian may require calf lymph.

2. Any medical practitioner, or vaccination officer, or public vaccinator may be required by any parent or other person having the custody of a child about to be vaccinated to state whether the lymph

lymph he is about to use for the vaccination of such child is calf lymph or humanised lymph, and any medical practitioner, or vaccination officer, or public vaccinator who shall refuse to make such statement, or shall wilfully make a false statement in reference thereto, shall be guilty of an offence, punishable on summary conviction by a fine not exceeding Ten Pounds.

Amendment of section

3. Section 28 of “The Vaccination Act, 1882,” shall extend to the said registered letters and notices.

Incorporation.

4. Except so far as is inconsistent herewith, “The Vaccination Act, 1882,” shall be read as one with this Act.
